Financial assistance granted through the C.A.R.E. (Companion Animal Relief Effort) Fund to provide assistance to pet owners who are unable to finance the medical treatment necessary for their pet's illness, injury, or routine care.

Temporary housing was provided for pets of victims of domestic violence, animals displaced due to fire, homelessness, hospitalization and other emergency situations, including the Newport gas outage this year.

Free cat food, dog food, and supplies were provided to individuals who were in need of assistance through our Potter Pet Food Pantry, and the Food Pantry at the Martin Luther King, Jr. Community Center.

## SPAY & NEUTER CLINIC

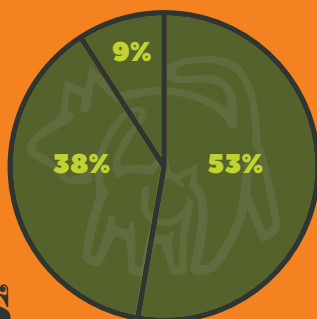

## 2019 Revenue and Expenses

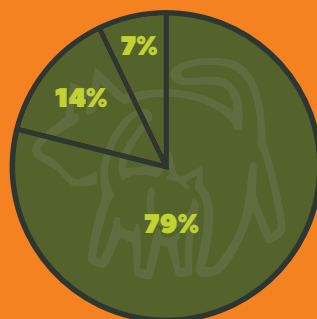
