After extensive testing, he was diagnosed with diabetes and an incredibly rare case of Cushing's disease. The disease is so rare that Dr. Sarah Crain, a Board-Certified Internal Medicine Specialist who works at our Pets In Need Veterinary Clinic, has seen only one other case of Cushing's in a cat.

United in our mission, our Shelter Medicine & Pets In Need Veterinary Clinic teams collaborated to ensure Kaiser received the highest quality care and attention. Despite the odds being stacked against him, Kaiser's sweet and gentle nature endeared him to everyone he met.
