Potter League's Pet Food Pantry Helps Pets Stay Home

At the Potter League for Animals, we believe that pets belong with the people who love them. It's a simple yet powerful truth, and it drives our programs and services aimed at supporting families and their pets, no matter the circumstances. One of the most vital ways we help make this a reality is through our Potter Pet Food Pantry.

Last year, we distributed an incredible 55,634 pounds of pet food to families in need — that's the equivalent of more than 178,029 meals for pets in our community. That's more than just food — it's peace of mind. For many, rising costs have made providing basic necessities challenging, with the price of pet food having increased significantly over the past few years. Pet food inflation alone has surged by over 12% in just the last two years, making it even harder for families to meet the needs of both their pets and themselves.

Pet food insecurity is real, and it forces many to make heartbreaking choices — like whether to use their own food supplies to feed their pets. This is where the Potter Pet Food Pantry steps in. By supplying pet food not only directly through our pantry but also to local human food pantries, we are helping ensure that no one has to make that kind of decision. This partnership makes access to pet food easier, less stressful, and more discreet, fostering an environment of dignity for families in need.

Our goal is to ensure that no family has to feel isolated or embarrassed when asking for help. We strive to create a welcoming and supportive space where pet guardians can receive the assistance they need, knowing they're part of a community that understands and cares.

The Potter Pet Food Pantry isn't just about keeping pets fed — it's about keeping them with their families, where they belong. By meeting people where they are, we provide essential support



that alleviates the burden of worry from pet owners who may be struggling. Our commitment extends beyond our pantry walls; we actively engage with the community through mobile food pantries, reaching out to nearly a dozen human food pantries statewide. This outreach ensures that pets continue to receive the love and care they deserve, no matter what challenges their families face.

By providing accessible pet food resources, we help create a safety net that allows families to keep their beloved companions close, fostering a bond that enriches both human and animal lives.

We rely on donations to keep this program going, and we gladly accept food donations, including open bags, as long as they're in the original packaging. We couldn't do this without the unbelievable support of local pet supply retailer Rumford Pet and the generous contributions from our community. Thanks to all who support this vital program, we're able to keep pets and their families together.

Over the course of seven weeks, Fern showed remarkable progress. She started taking treats and approaching staff, becoming more playful as we introduced her to other friendly, exuberant dogs. These interactions helped her gain confidence, and she learned to enjoy chasing toys and engaging in zoomies. By the end of her stay, Fern was seeking out affection and leaning into petting, a far cry from the shy dog who first arrived.

Fern is now a happy, playful pup who loves interacting with others. This transformation wouldn't be possible without the support of our generous donors.
