Mariah, affectionately known as Mariah the Wonder Dog by her adoptive family, became a symbol of hope and resilience. Despite the challenging prognosis, she lived her remaining three weeks with an inspiring grace, surrounded by the love and support of her dedicated adoptive family.

Mariah's journey was not traveled alone. Our Shelter Medicine Team worked tirelessly to keep her comfortable, providing the compassionate care that every animal deserves. Under the care of her devoted family, Mariah's days were a testament to the enduring spirit of animals facing adversity. Overcoming Odds: Martin's Recovery Journey

In the face of a medical emergency, the Pets In Need Veterinary Clinic staff demonstrated extraordinary dedication and skill. Martin, a critical patient, faced a life-threatening situation as a polyp in his throat restricted his breathing and ability to eat normally. Our clinic's doctor and staff worked quickly and carefully to remove the polyp, but the situation took a turn for the worse during Martin's recovery.

Martin experienced two alarming episodes while recovering from anesthesia, where he stopped breathing, and his heart ceased to beat. To further complicate matters, a sudden local power outage plunged the entire building into darkness. Undeterred by the chaos, the Pets In Need team exhibited quick thinking and resourcefulness. Using cell phone lights, they continued Martin's treatment, determined to revive him.

Through their unwavering efforts, the staff successfully revived Martin, marking the beginning of his journey to recovery. Astonishingly, on the same day, Martin began eating regular cat food for the first time without needing it pureed. The family, arriving later in the day, was overwhelmed with joy at the sight of their revived feline companion.

The dedication didn't end there. The next day, Pets In Need staff reached out to check on Martin's progress. The owner happily reported that Martin was thriving — running, playing, and enjoying normal cat food without the need for pureeing. This remarkable turnaround was made possible by the hard work, quick thinking, and dedication of the Pets In Need Clinic's staff, showcasing their commitment to the well-being of the animals under their care.

BMOD Graduates:

Our Behavior Team ensures that both our shelter animals and animals in our foster homes receive enrichment and behavior training. By supporting their mental well-being, dozens of dogs and cats "graduated" from our B-Mod program. Cooper

Cooper, a vibrant dog in need of behavior modification, underwent a transformative journey during his 20 weeks in our care. Initially displaying mouthing and over-aroused behavior, Cooper's interactions with staff

and volunteers raised concerns, leading to a strategic approach by our Behavior Team. Measures, such as providing a tug rope toy for redirection and monitoring his response to behavior medication, were introduced. Despite initial challenges, Cooper's progress became evident. His interactions with fellow dogs showcased a positive play dynamic, and foster care with another playful dog proved instrumental in his transformation. Under the attentive guidance of a foster caregiver, Cooper's behavior flourished, demonstrating compatibility with other pets and a diminished need for medication. The positive report paved the way for Cooper to find his ideal home with his foster family, who lovingly adopted him.



Luke

Luke, a 7-year-old male cat, arrived at our facility in distress. He was frozen in fear. Luke was surrendered because his previous home, while loving, was too busy for his comfort, resulting in occasional litter box issues. The family,

prioritizing his well-being, felt the living situation was unfair to him. With our Behavior Team's dedicated support, Luke gradually started to regain confidence over eight weeks. Initially hunkered down in his hidey, he slowly responded to gentle interaction, displaying signs of nervousness. As the days passed, Luke's progress was evident, from hiding behind his bed with flat ears to eventually coming out on his own, seeking affection, head rubs, and even climbing into laps. The breakthrough moment came when he exhibited genuine affection, head-butting, and enjoying full-body pets. Luke's transformation was because of the patience and care provided by our team. After this remarkable journey, Luke found a loving home where he could continue to thrive in a calm and understanding environment.

Through the Lens of Love: Wally's Journey Home

Found wandering a very busy roadway, Wally quickly became the heartthrob of our Animal Care & Adoption Center with his unwavering spirit and sheer determination.


