

For June and her dad, Carl, this program was a lifeline. Carl battled a chronic medical condition that required frequent hospital stays. June first entered the Pet Safe program in October of 2020, and over the years, she stayed with us more than a dozen times. For each visit, our staff and volunteers welcomed June with open arms, who quickly came to adore her warm, gentle spirit.

Carl's love for June was unshakable. She was his reason to keep fighting. Even when hospitalized, Carl called daily to check on her, his voice full of affection and concern. June brought him comfort and purpose, and their bond touched everyone who met them.

Sadly, this past year, June's most recent stay stretched longer than usual. We began to fear what the length of her visit might mean. And then, the heartbreaking call came — Carl had lost his battle with illness. Our hearts broke for him, for June, and for the incredible love they shared.

Carl's dog was his everything — his family, his comfort, and his reason to keep going. When we lost Carl, we



felt the weight of his love for June and knew we had to honor it by finding her the home she so deeply deserved. That's when Paul, one of our devoted volunteers, stepped forward. Paul had spent countless hours with June during her many stays, and in that time, he had grown to adore her. Paul and his family didn't just welcome June into their home — they opened their hearts to her. Today, June is flourishing, surrounded by love, care, and the warmth of a family that cherishes her — a beautiful continuation of the bond she shared with Carl, one that will never be forgotten.
